


# PRESS RELEASE FOR IMMEDIATE DISTRIBUTION



The Stations Éphémères ("ephemeral stations") cultural mediation project is back for a sixth edition. The project presents ephemeral works created in the *land art* tradition while incorporating a number of media (fine crafts, sculpture, painting and more). The works will be exhibited at six (6) different locations (stations) along the Corridor aérobique linear park, between Morin-Heights and Amherst.

The works will be created during the month of August and presented to the public, in a natural setting, from **August 20 to October 10, 2022**. The Corridor aérobique trail can be covered on foot or by bicycle to discover this beautiful arts project situated in the outdoors.

**WHERE:** Station #2 in Wentworth-Nord, at KM 14.5 of the Corridor aérobique. Parking can be found close to 1699 route Principale in Wentworth-Nord.

"When we look back, we see milestones that recall our passage on Earth and our identity: birth and death, marriage and friendships, accidents, achievements, travels... Yet in the midst of these many transformative moments, a long life would seem empty without also those things that are useless, obsolete, futile. With the materials at your disposal, *Brins de mémoires* invites you to showcase the micro-souvenirs of your passage within the structures created for this purpose, in order to reflect upon what also makes a full life. The sales receipt for that coffee on the go, the sheet of paper blown away by the sudden gust of wind, the lighter that no longer works found along the trail, all bear witness to the fact that we are also made up of an accumulation of little nothings, of wisps of memories, and I invite you to grant them a moment of your attention." — Annie Roy

**Trajectory:** Following a career in contemporary dance, artist Annie Roy founded, along with her spouse Pierre Allard, the socially engaged arts organization **ATSA**, **When Art Takes Action**, which will soon celebrate 25 years of existence. Within that framework, she produced and presented events and installations in the public space that delved into the major issues of the day, inviting us to be positive change agents for the good of humanity and nature. Pierre's passing in 2018 led Annie to spend more time in the Laurentians, where she would eventually seek greater involvement both socially and artistically. 
#### The 2022 edition's artists and artist collectives
